



- **Increased awareness and knowledge** of the SDGs among urban stakeholders in more than 24 cities;
- Supported innovative and 'first mover' innovations in city-level actions, including on:
  - Community-led sustainable waste management in line with the 3R's;
  - Re-think & reduce unnecessary single-use plastics;
  - Regenerating **urban green spaces**;
  - **MRV** of air quality and GHG emissions in model communities





Scaling up of waste separation at source, organic waste composting and rooftop gardens in cooperation with communities, schools and restaurants in Phuket City, Thailand


