

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# The concept behind CITYNET's establishment



☐ Established in 1987 to support member countries of UNESCAP (as initial objective)

☐ Has been hosted and led by the City of Yokohama (Japan was leading growth in the region)

□A unique network due to diversification of its members (60% local governments, 40% represents other key players in local development; \*reason behind CITYNET's engagement with the community)

CITYNET was created in response to the needs of Local 1987 Governments and local actors in the Asia-Pacific region (with support from UNESCAP, UNDP and UNHABITAT) - only 24 members


# **Composition of Membership**





#### Distribution cities based on size (%)




High percentage of low GDP/Capita member cities (a total of 75 cities)

High percentage of small and medium-sized cities (a total of 75 cities)


# Distribution of cities based on 2009 GDP/Capita (%) of the country










CITYNET has been promoting low carbon society by focusing on the following:


- Public transport reform



# Advocate Low Carbon Economy in Asia & Pacific



Organised the Forum on Low-Carbon Economy in Asia & Pacific (in cooperation with UNESCAP), Beijing, June 2009

#### The challenges are:

- Understanding the concept of LCE
- Limited funds
- Lack of human resource and institution capacity
- Lack of information
- Limited policies and regulations
- Technical gap

Policy dialogues on Challenges and Opportunities:

•Local institutions are not ready to address the issues due to low priority and awareness

#### **Outputs:**

- Need to raise awareness on sustainable consumption – change of life style;
- Data inventory on energy and GHGs;
- •Introduce energy into planning practices;
- Compilation of best practices at city and community level
- A reduction of energy consumption in existing buildings;
- •Introduce green rating systems, etc.

# **Advocate Sustainable Consumption & Green Purchasing**



#### **ACTIONS:**

- •Training/capacity building for local government leaders and officials;
- Awareness raising programmes & twinning arrangements on green procurement with those who need support;
- Setting up committee/team for green purchasing (at all levels and should be a part of stipulating ordinances and incentives for all actors);
- Launch the City Recycle Award (CITYNET, IGPN, etc.);
- Effective Environmental Education (ex. Opening Recycling Centres for education of youth)

#### **CHALLENGES:**

- Legislation enforcement
  & awareness on a large
  scale is still lacking;
- Need to understand about supply and demand cycle (ex. missing links on integrating green products and information system, criteria for green products);
- Appropriate technology transfer (ex. alternative energy as resource);
- Need to define and discuss green purchasing plans (inc. monitoring, increase producers)
