Background

- Proposal submitted in May 2011
- 2 cities participating (Palembang and Surabaya)
- Vision behind the proposal “to achieve Smart, Humane and Ecological City”
- National Implementing Agency is the Indonesian Ministry of Environment (MoE)
- National Project Manager latter on was appointed

Targets

- Within the participating cities (Palembang and Surabaya), waste generation can be decreased by 15%



Role of the NFP

- To guide the implementation schedule and issues with the two selected Model Cities - Palembang and Surabaya



Proposed Core Activities on Phase-1

- Public campaign on waste reduction
- Training and capacity building
- Establish waste bank system

Definition of Waste Bank

- An effort to enhance environmental awareness in the community by conducting domestic waste management to improve the environmental condition and as well to give value added benefit from domestic waste.

Key Events

- National Workshop (4 October 2011)
- Selection of Liaison Officers for Palembang and Surabaya (Since August 2011)
- Supervision of trainings in Palembang and Surabaya and support to the set up of the waste bank in both cities (August 2011 – February 2012)
- Evaluation workshop (28 – 29 December 2012)

Findings by the NFP

- Introduction of waste bank system by taking best practices from Yogyakarta
- Study tours or study exchange is a good way to do interactive learning
- The set up of waste bank system needs to have support and commitment from from key agencies within the city e.g. Mayor's commitment, cooperation among Environment Agency, Agency for Cleanliness and Public Work Agency
- The mechanism to measure the impacts of waste bank needs to be developed

Future Activities

- New cities will be included for the ASEAN Model Cities Programme
- Best practices from Palembang and Surabaya in the set-up of the waste bank system will be replicated to other cities
- Waste management will be included as one of the focuses under the AWGESC activities along with other existing activities.
