#### Concept:

The 7<sup>th</sup> High Level Seminar on Environmentally Sustainable Cities (7HLS ESC) takes place at the dawn of the post-2015 era. This is when the world begins a fresh journey towards realising the newly-adopted global Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in line with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

For seven years since 2010, the HLS seminar (http://hls-esc.org) has been held annually with growing scale and ground reach (through the ASEAN ESC Model Cities Programme), arriving in 2016 at a juncture for reflection and rejuvenation. The 7HLS will be a special occasion to discuss how to redesign the HLS based on the past achievements in order to better serve the region's needs for tackling both traditional and emerging challenges affecting East Asian cities.

The seminar will once again gather important 'change makers' to share knowledge and experiences, highlight exciting innovations as well as discuss the way forward for reinvigorating the 2030 Agenda on ESC cooperation to help East Asia's cities transform into greener, cleaner, climate-friendly and resilient living spaces.

#### Objectives:

- Discuss and develop recommendations to the EAS Environment Ministers on how to advance ESC regional cooperation towards the 2030 Agenda, particularly through a redesigned 'new HLS ESC' in 2017.

- 2. Identify and highlight key programmes/activities of important stakeholders that could contribute to the 'new HLS ESC' and EAS ESC cooperation in the context of 2030 Agenda.
- 3. Showcase innovative, game-changing ESC practices/policies and technologies in the region;
- 4. Promote networking, cooperation and knowledge exchange among key ESC stakeholders from governments, academia, civil society, international organisations, and private sector, etc.
