



70% increase since the Paris Agreement was adopted




Cities that disclose through CDP take more action




Cities that have disclosed to CDP for 3 years or more, report significantly higher levels of emissions measurement and management data, risk recognition and adaptation actions and opportunities.




31 cities in Asia and Oceania have a city-wide emissions reduction target

<p>Adelaide is striving to have zero net carbon emissions by 2025. This is achieved by the goal of making Adelaide the world's first carbon neutral city.</p> <p>Adelaide, Australia</p>	<p>Kolkata is currently ranked as the third most sustainable city in the world from coastal flooding. Making its low-income population the most sustainable due to green construction materials.</p> <p>Kolkata, India</p>	<p>In 2000, Taipei imposed a Bag Trash Collection Fee, which aimed to reduce the efficiency of recycling, sorting and recycling. The environmental results in the past decade are marked 3,691,900 TCO2e.</p> <p>Taipei, Taiwan</p>	<p>Sydney in 2014 awarded a tender to retrofit 43 of its major buildings with energy and water saving measures. They led to energy use by 6,054 kWh, reduction greenhouse gas emissions by 21% per year and water by 18% per year.</p> <p>Sydney, Australia</p>	<p>Canberra is improving buildings and parking through its new city infrastructure strategy to enhance the resilience of public spaces.</p> <p>Canberra, Australia</p>
